Success Story

As you know, RSVP provides a free income tax preparation service every year from late January through mid-April. This year was extremely active! We had 25 volunteers, who helped almost 1,600 clients and prepared 1,419 tax returns! That is just counting the federal tax returns – not including state returns.

Our volunteers worked in eight different locations,

Monday through Friday, to make it as convenient & easy as possible for anyone who needed help to get it. Volunteers even made special appointments when necessary, and visited assisted living homes, a high school, and other agencies to help people with their tax returns. All of our tax volunteers say that the reason they do this is because clients are so appreciative!

Because of all this hard work by our volunteers, these clients got back over \$1.4 million in refunds – and because this service was free, all of that money went into their pockets! They did not have to pay someone to prepare their return or to get information.

So if you know one of our wonderful tax volunteers, remember to congratulate them on a job well done!
