### Success Story

For many years now (I don't know exactly how many), social service agencies in Etowah County have coordinated together to help people for Christmas.

The Salvation Army, Etowah Baptist Missions Center, Toys 4 Tots, Catholic Center of Concern, Hokes Bluff Lions Club and Gadsden Fire Department, to name a few, take information from people asking for help and complete one master list of requests. This way, more people are assisted, the agencies' donations go farther, and requests can be matched to donors in a more beneficial way.

When you see an Angel Tree (like our Senior Angel Tree), this is where those requests come from.

If you know of anyone who needs assistance this year, they can sign up at any of these agencies. Signups will start mid-October this year. Call us if you need phone numbers or addresses.
